

Reynolds Landing House is located in the heart of the Historic District. Dating from 1853, Reynolds Landing House is only a block away from the splendor of Forsyth Park.



- General**
- Main content:**
 - Content that isn't the navigation or the footer should have a main landmark
 - Font sizes should be set in ems for better scalability, with body text no smaller than 12 px
 - Annotations:**
 - Navigation:
 - Navigation links should be underlined so it's clear they're interactive UI by more than color alone
 - Primary navigation is best on the left side of the page for users using full screen magnification who typically navigate from the left side
 - Nav should be contained in a navigation landmark
 - Carousel:
 - Carousel container should have the following ARIA roles:
 - role="region" or role="group" so screen reader users can skip past it if they want
 - roledescription="carousel"
 - label="[content that describes the photos, like property photos]"
 - Each slide should also have the following ARIA roles:
 - role="group"
 - roledescription="slide"
 - an accessible name with aria-label that describes the slide and its position (eg. "1 of 10")
 - Carousels should have previous and next slide button controls in addition to slide picker controls
 - "View all" button:
 - Button would be better below the carousel to simplify a complicated element, so screen reader users can encounter it if they skipped the carousel, and so magnification users can find it
 - Triggering this button should open a new page with all photos instead of layering on an overlay, which can be difficult to navigate for screen reader users
 - "About" heading: Consider changing the heading content to remove "Reynolds Landing House" and avoid redundancy with the page's H1 (see mobile render)
 - "About" text:
 - Text in two columns is challenging for users with low vision to read, and screen reader reading order can be confusing. Instead, consider single-column text with frequent line breaks or subheadings
 - Consider editing the content itself to use simpler, plainer language so users with limited English proficiency or cognitive disabilities can understand easier
 - Amenities list:
 - Ensure list is created with appropriate HTML list semantics, like and
 - Ensure content is consistently formatted and avoid using abbreviations like "Min." for "Minimum"
 - Map & content:
 - Add another H3 to group map-related content from the Amenities (see mobile render)
 - Consider moving address above the map or in the "About" section since it's buried within the page content and might be challenging for all users to find, especially screen reader users
 - If map is an image, ensure sufficient alt text describes the location of the map pin succinctly (eg. "Map with pin at the intersection of Peach St and Fayette Way")
 - If map is an interactive widget,
 - "Request" heading: Consider changing the heading content to simplify and better summarize the content in the section below (see mobile render)
 - Form:
 - Like content in two columns, forms with multiple columns are difficult to follow for low vision users & those with cognitive disabilities. Consider stacking form fields in one column, and use two columns for related fields like To/From dates
 - Indicate which fields are required, or state that all fields are required in the copy
 - Stack form field labels vertically instead of horizontally for better visual tracking and consistency
 - Ensure form labels are consistent: avoid using "your" and any abbreviations
 - Ensure fields have appropriate input purposes for fields like name and email
 - Form errors:
 - Ensure form error copy uses icons as well as color to call out errors
 - Ensure errors are specific, stating which field is in error and how to fix it (eg. "Please enter a first name")
 - If fields are validated when focus leaves a field, use aria-live to dynamically announce "Error in previous field + [error message]" so a screen reader user knows the validation happened
 - Datepickers:
 - Replace "To/From" field labels with more specific labels, and eliminate the copy above (see mobile render)
 - Include formatting guidance as part of the field label
 - Calendar button element that opens a calendar should be scripted: check [Deque's datepicker example](#)
 - Radio group:
 - Wrap radio buttons and label in an HTML <fieldset>
 - Ensure label is in the HTML <legend>
 - Ensure each radio has a role="radio" and is ARIA-labelled by the visible label
 - "OK" button: Consider using more specific content like "Request quote" so user knows what will happen when button is triggered
 - Footer:
 - Place most important content first, and include the site name
 - Ensure email is formatted as a link with underline so users can easily enable it
 - Wrap footer in a contentinfo landmark
 - Social media links: Ensure icon links have a useful accessible name (eg. "Facebook, link") so screen reader users know where they will go

Mobile:

 - Consider collapsing navigation into a hamburger menu button with an accessible name (eg. "Menu")
 - Font should scale appropriately by ems, ensure body is no smaller than 16 px
 - Ensure proper target size between interactive elements like form fields of 24x24 px


Mobile carousel:

 - Ensure previous and next slide buttons have appropriate accessible names
 - Consider removing slide position buttons for small target size

Ensure web pages contain a hidden skip link for users using a keyboard or screen reader to bypass navigation blocks


